Don Esterbrook: The Port is diversification of cargo business. Don has been worked with WWL for past couple of years to develop an "omni site" on the East Blair 1 peninsula. The greatest challenge is the timing of the project. A project that normally takes2 years has been compression 13 months. The terminal needs to be partially operational by end of year as the first ship will arrive December 15. The Port and WWL have entered into a 30-year lease agreement.

     currently one of the building to be demolished is occupied. Anticipated date of
     relocation is late June early July.

  - Mobilization demobilization
     is a formula related to submittals, progress and closeout
  - Unit Price for off-site disposal of contaminated soil site has been remediated. Two areas remain that are capped with 4 6 feet of compacted clean fill. Contract pay item is an allowance to be adjusted up or down based on quantity.
  - Unforeseen obstructions bid item site has some buried foundations that may be encounter during storm or light pole installation. Pay item is an allowance that may be adjusted up or down. Most likely paid on a time and material basis per the Contract.

- D1.2 Building demolition 2 buildings, 1 modular that is being surplus and 1 remaining building originally intended for another project that is now on hold; may move to other location or issue addendum for contractor to salvage/demolish.
- D1.0-D1.1 Site has been fully remediated. There are two areas contamination (former log yard and wet scrubber area) that does not impact ground water have been capped with 4- 6 feet of clean fill. All other areas have been completely remediated/removed. During storm system and lighting may potential encounter this contamination shown on plans on north side of site. This material would go to a Subtitle C landfill (LRI).
- D1.3 Foundation that may be encountered with deep trenching or light poles are shown on the plans. Additional foundation may be encountered.
- D1.6 area where stripping is required has been greatly reduced. Areas that require stripping are shown.
